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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Advancing Access to Education, Transforming Futures

In 2025, Tuendele Foundation continued to make meaningful strides in expanding access to quality tertiary education for talented but financially vulnerable students. Through our holistic scholarship, mentorship and internship model, we directly supported 27 active college and university scholars and 11 alumni, thus contributing to the academic, professional, and social development of young people and communities across Kenya.

Over the past eight years, Tuendele Foundation has positively impacted more than 1600+ lives, both directly and indirectly, through scholarships, mentorship, internships, ambassador engagement, and community outreach initiatives. The direct involvement of our beneficiaries—who actively give back to their communities—remains a cornerstone of our impact model. Through sustained academic, mentorship, and psychosocial support, Tuendele Foundation enabled scholars to remain enrolled, perform academically, and advance toward graduation and employment pathways. All funds received in 2025 were managed with transparency and accountability and were directed toward scholarships, mentorship activities, scholar welfare, and program implementation in line with the Foundation's mission.

During the 2025 reporting period, the Foundation recorded a scholar retention rate of 100%, reflecting effective program design, consistent mentorship engagement, and appropriate academic and psychosocial support mechanisms. In 2025, our strategic priorities focused on:

- Welcoming 9 new scholars into the Tuendele Foundation program,
- Expanding the Tuendele Foundation Ambassadors Network to reach new donors and partners across Africa, America, and Europe,
- Growing our corporate partnerships to strengthen sustainability,
- Achieving a 1:1 mentor-mentee ratio to enhance scholar support, and
- Working toward a USD 61,417 (KES 7.8 million) annual funding budget to sustain and scale our programs.

We remain deeply grateful to our donors, mentors, volunteers, ambassadors, and partners whose unwavering support continues to transform lives. As we reflect on the progress achieved in 2025, we are inspired by the resilience of our scholars

and energized by the opportunities ahead as we enter the next phase of Tuendele Foundation's journey.

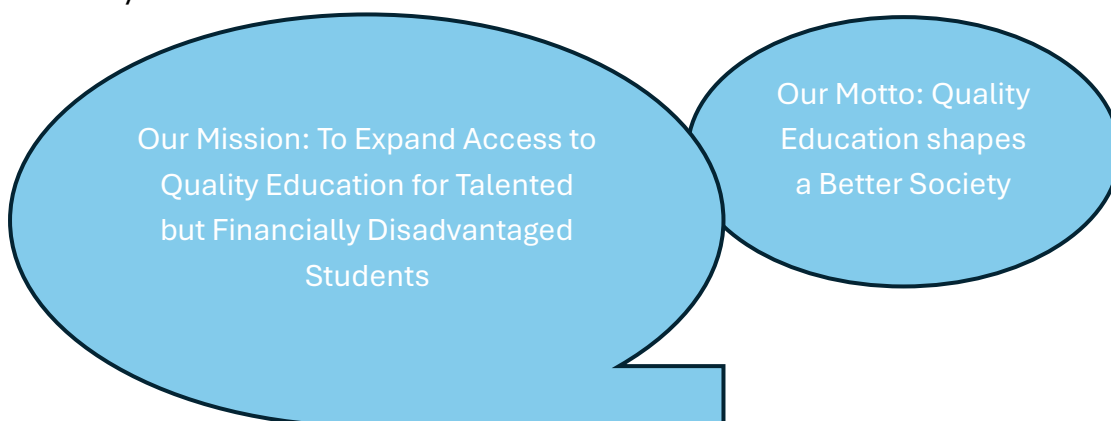
1. INTRODUCTION



1.1. Education for Transformation

Education is a fundamental human right and a shared responsibility. At Tuendele Foundation, we believe that access to quality education is one of the most powerful tools for breaking cycles of poverty and unlocking human potential.

As a non-profit organization, Tuendele Foundation is aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4) ensuring inclusive, equitable, and quality education while promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all. Our work is rooted in the conviction that when young people are supported to pursue higher education, they become agents of change within their families, communities, and the broader society.



Through scholarships, mentorship, internships, and job placement support, we empower university and college students particularly those pursuing business, finance, and accounting-related courses to thrive academically, professionally, and personally.

2. OUR PROGRAMMES: APPROACH TO EDUCATION FOR TRANSFORMATION

2.1. SCHOLARSHIPS

Tuendele Foundation offers comprehensive scholarships that cover tuition, examination fees, accommodation, and stipends for talented, underprivileged students pursuing tertiary education. Our current focus is on supporting those enrolled in Finance, Business, and accounting courses who would otherwise be unable to afford these essential costs.

We recognize the transformative power of education to change lives and communities for the better. Each year, we open our scholarship application process, carefully selecting bright and deserving students through a rigorous interview and evaluation procedure. Successful applicants receive not only financial support but also access to a supportive community dedicated to their academic and personal growth.

2.2. MENTORSHIP

2.2.1. Nurturing Potential Beyond the Classroom

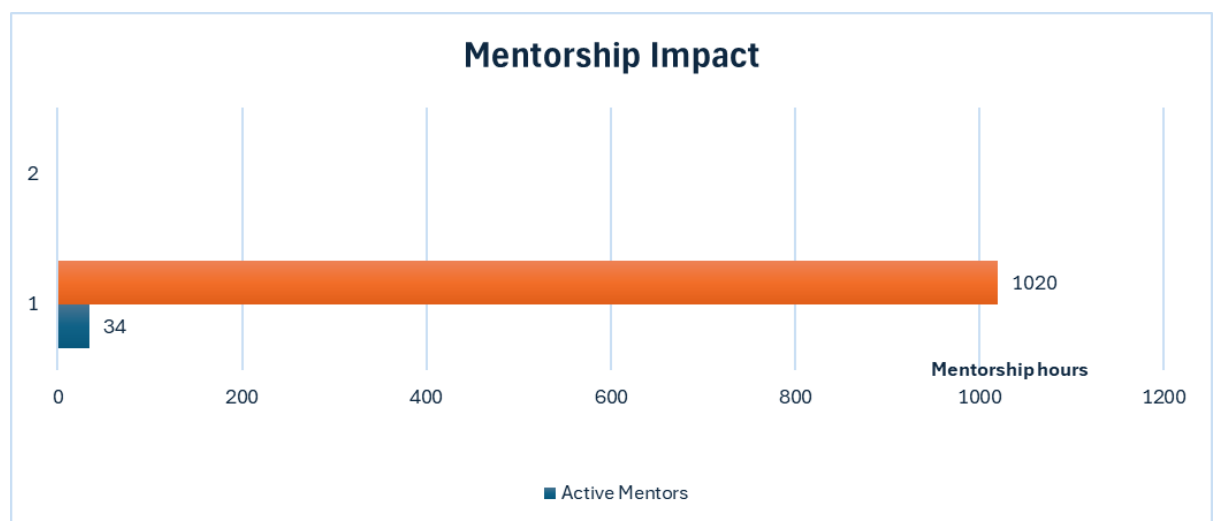
At Tuendele Foundation, mentorship is a core pillar of our holistic scholar support model. We recognize that financial assistance alone is not sufficient to ensure student success. Our mentorship program is designed to provide scholars with guidance, psychosocial support, career exposure, and life skills that prepare them for both academic excellence and professional growth.

Each Tuendele scholar is paired with a dedicated mentor drawn from diverse professional backgrounds, including finance, accounting, business management, and entrepreneurship. Mentors support scholars through regular one-on-one sessions, group engagements, and structured learning forums that promote academic accountability, personal development, and career readiness.

In 2025, the Foundation prioritized strengthening mentor–mentee relationships by working toward a 1:1 mentor–mentee ratio, ensuring personalized support and meaningful engagement throughout the academic journey.

2.2.2. Mentorship Impact in 2025

- 34 active mentors engaged
- 1,020+ mentorship hours delivered
- Regular academic check-ins and structured goal-setting sessions
- Career guidance including CV development and interview preparation
- Psychosocial support and personal development coaching



In **July 2025**, Tuendele Foundation facilitated an industry exposure and mentorship visit to **Google**, where **31** students comprising of 17 scholars from Tuendele Foundation and 13 other students from KCA and Strathmore University were introduced to real-world workplace environments, innovation culture, and career opportunities within the technology and business ecosystem. The visit provided scholars with valuable market exposure, practical insights, and inspiration, further strengthening the link between academic learning and professional aspirations.

Through mentorship, scholars gain confidence, clarity, and resilience—key attributes that enable them to navigate academic challenges and transition successfully into the world of work.

Earlier in **January 2025**, the Tuendele Scholars had had another eye-opening and insightful mentorship opportunity through an industrial visit at **Tata Chemicals Magadi Ltd**. The CFO of Tata Magadi and his team explained costing and cost management to the eager scholars.



2.2.3. Mentor-Mentee Bonding Session

Successful mentorship commences with bonding between scholars (mentees) and their mentors. In **November** the Tuendeleee mentors and mentees had a wonderful opportunity to meet at the serene gardens of **Osotua Tented Camp** for an opportunity to connect, share thoughts, ideate on how to make the mentorship experience more rewarding, and for the mentees to learn from the experienced professionals who serve as their mentors.



2.3. ALUMNI & GRADUATE OUTCOMES

2.3.1. From Scholars to Changemakers

Tuendeleee Foundation is committed to supporting scholars beyond graduation, ensuring they transition successfully into employment, professional development, and community leadership. As of December 2025, we are proud to have **13 alumni** in our program, all of whom still benefit from mentorship, internship and job placement support, while participating in community impact projects.

2.3.2. Graduate Transitions and Career Pathways

In 2025, Tuendeleo alumni and graduating scholars demonstrated strong progression into the world of work and professional growth. Graduates accessed opportunities including formal employment, internship placements, and trainee programs within both the private and public sectors. Others pursued further studies and professional certification courses aimed at strengthening their employability and long-term career prospects.

Through structured mentorship, career guidance, CV development, and industry exposure, scholars are equipped with practical skills, professional confidence, and clarity on career pathways, enabling smoother transitions from academic environments into professional settings.

2.3.3. Internships and Work Readiness

During the reporting period, **11 Tuendelee Foundation scholars were on internship placements**, offering scholars valuable hands-on experience and exposure to real-world work environments. These placements enhanced technical skills, workplace professionalism, and professional networking, contributing to improved employment readiness among scholars. We are proud that another **13 of our scholars are employed**.

2.3.4. Alumni Giving Back

A defining feature of the Tuendelee model is the culture of giving back. Alumni remain engaged by mentoring current scholars, participating in community outreach initiatives, supporting fundraising and ambassador activities, and sharing career guidance with new cohorts as well as high school or younger students in the communities. Their lived experiences provide practical insights into academic persistence, career planning, and professional growth. This continued involvement strengthens the Foundation's impact while fostering leadership, empathy, and social responsibility among graduates.

2.3.5. Looking Ahead

As the alumni network grows, Tuendelee Foundation is strengthening alumni engagement structures to enhance mentorship, networking, and long-term impact. By supporting graduates beyond completion of their studies, the Foundation ensures that its scholars emerge as self-reliant professionals and changemakers within their communities.

2.3.6. Scholar Success Story: Anita Mmbaya (Class of 2025)

First KCA University Tuendelee Scholar Graduates with Honors

In 2025, Tuendelee Foundation marked a key program milestone with the graduation of **Anita Mmbaya**, the first Tuendelee scholar from KCA University to complete her studies, graduating with honours. Anita's achievement reflects the effectiveness of Tuendelee Foundation's holistic scholar support model, combined with a strong partnership with learning institutions like **KCA University**.

This model combines targeted financial assistance with structured mentorship, continuous academic follow-up and industrial exposure. This integrated approach enabled Anita to remain enrolled, progress on time, achieve strong academic performance throughout her university journey, and get exposure .

Her successful completion of higher education contributes directly to Tuendele Foundation's objective of improving access, retention, and completion rates for students from vulnerable backgrounds. It also demonstrates the value of donor investment in long-term, student-centred support systems. As we reflect on the Foundation's impact in 2025, Anita's graduation stands as measurable evidence that sustained support translates into tangible educational outcomes.

Anita benefited from first hand practical experience at [Tuendele Consulting](#) , Tuendele Foundation's **bookkeeping and professional services** firm that provides practical experience to the Scholars while serving SMEs with affordable and reliable accounting and financial management services. She is currently serving as an Accounts Intern at Alliance Francaise.

2.4. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & OUTREACH

2.4.1. Giving Back to the Community

Community engagement and social responsibility are core to Tuendele Foundation's values. Beyond supporting scholars academically and professionally,

the Foundation is committed to nurturing compassionate, socially responsible leaders who actively contribute to the wellbeing of their communities.

In 2025, Tuendele Foundation strengthened its community outreach efforts through participating in giving back to others in need of support within the community.

In June this year Tuendele scholars and staff visited the **Good Shepherd Home** in Chokaa, Nairobi, which houses children with mental disabilities. Making time to play with the children, participating in cleaning their facilities and connecting with their team was an opportunity to bring warmth to the home. Indeed, it costs nothing to light another person's candle or bring joy to their heart.

2.4.2. Alliance Classic Run 2025

In **May 2025**, Tuendele Foundation took part in the **Alliance Classic Run (ACR)**, a flagship fundraising event aimed at mobilizing resources to support the students of Alliance High School. The event brought together corporate partners, donors,

volunteers, and community members united by a shared commitment to advancing access to quality education. Tuendelee believes that supporting those in high school enables a stronger participation at tertiary education level, where Tuendelee takes over.

Supporting others always has a ripple effect. Whilst contributing to funds raised for Alliance High school at the Classic Run, Tuendelee benefited by:

- Getting Tuendelee scholars to enjoy a team-building extra-curricular experience. One scholar, Dennis, an avid athlete emerged 6th in the run.
- Networking opportunities – Tuendelee linked up with Nijenge Uwazi Microfinance which has so far provided internship to two of Tuendelee Scholars – Mary Mbithe and Rhoda Kivinya.
- An opportunity for Tuendelee scholars to give back by supporting others – a strong pillar of Tuendelee’s model of paying it forward.

Participation in the Alliance Classic Run enhanced Tuendelee’s visibility, strengthened relationships with existing partners, and opened opportunities for new collaborations. The event also provided a platform to showcase the Foundation’s mission, impact, and long-term vision to a broader audience.

Our 7th Annual Fundraiser held in October saw us receive **matching donations** that boosted our fundraising target and ensured we met our goal for the event. We are grateful to those who contributed, and those who matched the gifts. We welcome other partners who may consider similar resource-mobilising models.

3.3. Strategic Institutional and Partner Collaborations

In 2025, Tuendele Foundation strengthened collaborations with key academic, sector, corporate, and philanthropic partners to advance our mission. **Vision Institute of Professionals, Strathmore University** and **KCA University** continued supporting scholars through admissions guidance, tuition collaboration, and student engagement.



Long-standing philanthropic partner **Nice to Meet You Foundation (NTMY)** continued to transform lives through the Sifa Sponsorship Package, directly supporting **five** scholars in 2025. Barbara Roversi, CEO of NTMY, noted: *"Thanks to our partnership with Tuendelee Foundation, we are able to create meaningful impact beyond our borders."*

SME Founders Association provided entrepreneurship exposure and professional networking opportunities, while **SPURT** enhanced capacity building, visibility, and community engagement. **Wingubox** contributed through software support and institutional strengthening, reinforcing sustainability and accountability.



These collaborations ensure holistic support for scholars, preparing them for successful academic and professional journeys.

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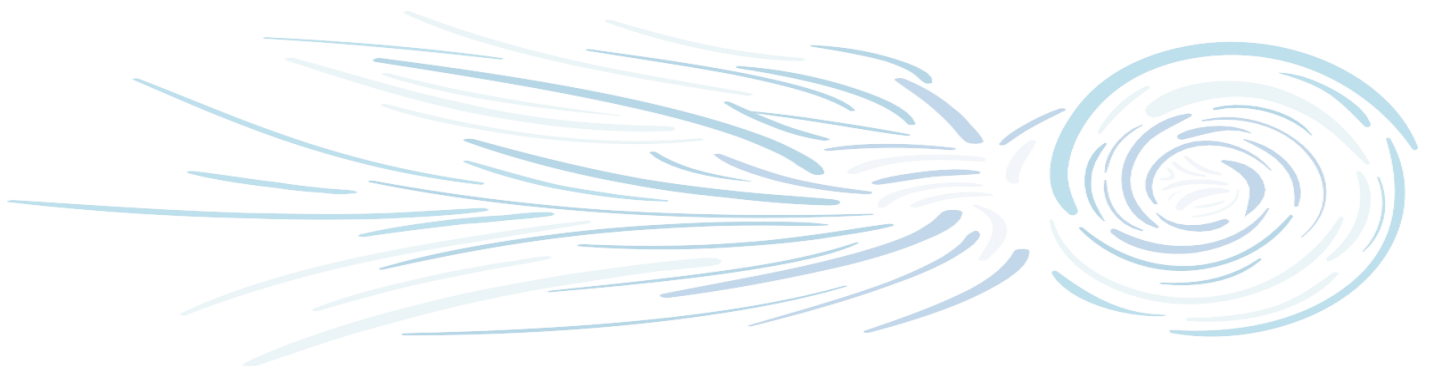
